SECURITY AND HUMAN RIGHTS MASTER'S DEGREE COURSE



Entirely delivered in English, the Programme offers a 2-year course covering the main contemporary challenges related to the much-debated dichotomy security vs human rights. The Programme provides multidisciplinary competences (in law, political science, sociology, history, philosophy, economics) required in strategic and high-level innovation sectors, such as migration and border security, privacy and data protection, green economy and environmental sustainability.

First academic year (6/7 exams): focus on the main challenges arising from Global Security (Fall Semester) and Criminalisation Trends (Spring Semester).

Second academic year (5/6 exams): two alternative paths with a higher level of specialisation.

- Security and Human Mobility: path dedicated to migratory processes, with two semesters concerning, respectively, the security of borders and the management of migratory flows in the Euro-Mediterranean area (External Dimension) and the processes of legal, economic and cultural integration of migrants (Internal Dimension).
- Security, Technology and Sustainability: path dedicated to the new challenges to fundamental rights connected to the use of technology, with two semesters focusing, respectively, on Privacy and Data Protection and on Green Security.

ADMISSION

The Programme in Security & Human Rights is accessible to all the graduate students who:

- hold a first or second level degree in Law, Political Sciences and International Relations, Administrative Science, Sociology or History
- possess a B2 level of English proficiency, certified by an official language test (e.g. IELTS, TOEFL) or assessed at the University of Tuscia.

FEES, SCHOLARSHIP AND GRANTS

Fees

Enrolled students will pay a fixed tuition fee ranging from 520 to 1000 Euros depending on the country of origin.

LazioDisco Scholarships

- 2.000 scholarships available for international and Italian students / amount: up to 5.250 Euros per year
- 510 Euros per month for ERASMUS+ international mobility, granted to students eligible to LazioDisco
- Accommodation in the UNITUS campus (single or double room with private bathroom)
- · Access to canteens for lunch and dinner

Additional Grants

- 30 dedicated Scholarships for international students / amount: 4.900 Euros per year
- Ticket Grants of 500 Euros for the first 20 international students enrolling in a.y. 2021/2022
- Erasmus+KA107 International Credit Mobility (ICM) Scholarships for Double Degrees with non-EU countries: 850 Euros per month for incoming international students



WHY UNITUS?

The University of Tuscia (UNITUS) is located in the historical centre of Viterbo, a beautiful medieval city between Rome and Florence, where history and nature meet to create fascinating landscapes, close to the Mediterranean Sea, the Vico and Bolsena lakes and the biggest Italian airport (Rome Fiumicino). The University of Tuscia is made by six Departments, which offer to 9.000 students more than 30 undergraduate and master's degree programmes, as well as 7 PhD programmes.

THE DISTU DEPARTMENT

In addition to the Master's degree in Security and Human Rights (LM-90), the Department of Modern Languages, Literature, History, Philosophy and Law Studies (DISTU) hosts a Master's Degrees in Law (5-year programme) and other programmes in Modern Languages and Literatures, Political Science, International Security Studies and Public Communication; Archaeology and Art History.

CIRCULAR ECONOMY

MASTER'S DEGREE



The degree course in Circular Economy provides students with a series of innovative tools to operate in context of economic and environmental sustainability, aimed at the enhancement of natural resources, the use of secondary raw materials, sustainable management of the value chain and implementation of industrial symbiosis. The course aims to provide students with the necessary skills to be able to operate consciously in different, often heterogeneous areas, but all relatable to the possibility of integrating technological innovation and new skills in productive reconversion and sustainable development activities. The two curricula share a common program. aimed at teaching topics, methods, and tools appropriate to a circular approach to economy.

The structure of the course: Two Curricula

1st year: a common program oriented to the learning of subjects, methods, and tools often used in a circular approach to the economy.

2nd year: two options.

- The Green curriculum is focused on the "green economy": industrial production in a circular vision, where each process is characterized by a sustainable approach through reduced use of traditional raw mate-rials, the use of new forms of energy, recovery, and recycling, the use of natural substances and reuse of waste from other sectors.
- The Blue curriculum is oriented towards a circular approach to maritime economy, often referred to as the "blue economy", in all its forms: tourism, nature, logistics, and trade.
